Crop	Variety	Days to Maturity	Additional Plant Info
Tomato-Slicing	Crimson Sprinter	65	Determinate. Bright red fruits, averaging 5-7 oz each. Juicy and sweet with classic tomato flavor. When planting leave 1 ft of space between plants and 4 ft of space between rows. Plant will grow to 3 ft tall.
Tomato-Slicing	Black Beauty	80	Indeterminate. Super-tomato flavor loaded with antioxidants. Very meaty tomato with striking blue-black skin. When planting, leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Carbon	90	Indeterminate. Produces large 8-12 oz dark fruits that resist cracking. Excellent for salads and sandwiches. Flavor has been described as smoky and peppery. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Cherokee Purple	72	Indeterminate. Brownish-purple skin with green shoulders and red flesh. Large beefsteak fruits can weigh up to 1 pound. Believed to trace back over 100 years to the Cherokee Indians. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants and 4 ft of space between rows.

Tomato-Slicing	Costoluto Genovese	90	Indeterminate. Vigorous plants produce ribbed, firm, fleshy, sweet fruits that weigh up to 7 oz. Good disease resistance. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Dad's Sunset	78	Indeterminate. Uniformly round meaty fruits of 10-14 oz with a golden-orange color and sweet, fruity flavor. Good disease resistance.
Tomato-Slicing	Dr. Wyche's Yellow	80	Indeterminate. Light-yellow, rich-tasting fruit that mature to golden-orange. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Hartman's Yellow Gooseberry	75	Indeterminate. Large yellow cherry tomatoes with mildly sweet flavor. When planting leave 2-3 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Hillbilly Potato Leaf	85	Indeterminate. Beefsteak tomato with orange-yellow streaks through red mottled skin. When planting, leave 1.5-3 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Icicle Yellow	70-80	Indeterminate. Golden yellow, elongated fruit with sweet, fruity flavor. Great fresh, in salsas or canned. When planting, leave 3 ft of space between plants.

Tomato-Slicing	Lucky Tiger	70	Indeterminate. Ripe fruit is yellow with green stripes and a red blush. When planting, leave 2-3 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Mushroom Basket	75	Indeterminate. Produces large 8-16 oz watermelon-pink tomatoes. Firm, sweet tomatoes with few seeds. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Rebekah Allen	70	Indeterminate. Heavy yields of large pink fruits with sweet to tart flavor. When planting leave 1- 2 ft of space between plants and 4 ft of space between rows.
Tomato-Slicing	San Marzano	82	Indeterminate. Famous Italian cooking tomato. Plum-shaped fruit with thin skin and meaty flesh used for sauces and Margherita pizza.
Tomato-Slicing	Solar Flare	85	Indeterminate. A gourmet beefsteak tomato with golden metallic stripes on bright red 6-10 oz fruit. Well-balanced, sweet-acid flavor. When planting, leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Slicing	Tang	85	Indeterminate. Orange-red fruits with a high level of beta carotene and great flavor. When planting leave 1 ft of space between plants and 4 ft of space between rows.

Tomato-Slicing	Thornburn's Terra-Cotta	75	Indeterminate. Copper brown skin with pink flesh and shimmering green innards. First introduced in 1893. When planting, leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Cherry	Isis Candy	90	Indeterminate. Yields bicolor rose-red fruits with yellow-gold marbling and rich, fruity flavor.
Tomato-Cherry	Pink Bumblebee	70	Indeterminate. Pink striped cherry tomatoes that are great for eating fresh. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Cherry	Rosella	70	Indeterminate. High-yielding plants with 1/2 oz fruits great for eating fresh, grilling or making tomato paste. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Tomato-Cherry	Sun Gold	57	Indeterminate, hybrid variety that produces plump, tangerine colored fruits that are sweet and juicy. When planting leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Hot Pepper	Early Jalapeño	60 (green)/ 80(red)	Medium-hot, 3" fruits with a Scoville heat unit rating of 2,500-5,000. When planting, leave 2 ft of space between plants and 3 ft of space between rows.

Crop	Variety	Days to Maturity	Additional Plant Info
Eggplant	Black Beauty	80	Plant produces beautiful lavender blossoms that grow into a glossy, purplish-black fruit. When planting, leave 1.5 ft of space between plants and 2.5 ft of space between rows. To encourage earlier fruiting, when the plant is 15" tall, prune the bottom 4 suckers. To encourage more fruits, pick off the first few flowers. Harvest when fruit is about 6" long and skin is shiny.
Eggplant	Florida High Bush	75-85	This is a historic variety, bred in Florida in the 1940s. Vigorous, upright plants that bear large purple-black fruits throughout the season. Easy to harvest since fruits are held high off the ground. Disease and drought resistant. When planting, leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Eggplant	Little Finger	65	Small, slender eggplants with glossy black skin and mild flavor; ideal for quick cooking in a stir fry. Produce an early, prolific crop. When planting, leave 1.5 ft of space between plants.

Cucumber	Holland White	60	Produces uniform white fruits with sweet, crunchy flesh. Best grown in mounds of 1 ft in diameter with no more than 3 plants per mound and 6 ft of space between mounds. Provide support or trellis to save space.
Cucumber	Lemon	68	Pale yellow, round fruits about the size of a lemon prized by foodies for its citrusy flavor and unusual appearance. When planting, leave 1 ft of space between plants and 5 ft between rows.
Cucumber	Homemade Pickles	55	Compact vining plant (4ft) makes it great for container growing (with a trellis for support). Plant has excellent disease resistance and produces high yields of fruits that can be eaten fresh or pickled! Harvest when fruits are 1.5-5" long.
Summer Squash	Dark Green Zucchini	50	Traditional variety of summer squash that produces large quantities of straight fruit. Great for baking and the grill! Plant 1 row in center of raised bed, leaving at least 1 ft of space between plants. If planting more than 1 row, leave 5 ft of space between rows.

Crop	Variety	Days to Maturity	Additional Plant Info
Summer Squash	Yellow Crookneck	50	Standard summer squash with bright yellow skin, famous for crook in the neck. Plant 1 row in center of raised bed, leaving at least 1 ft of space between plants. If planting more than 1 row, leave 5 ft of space between rows. Pick squash when they are 5-8" long for best quality.
Winter Squash	Red Kuri	95	Winter Squash that produces red-orange fruits shaped like teardrops. Good for baking and steaming, in soups or pies. Plant 1 row in center of raised bed, leaving 1.5 ft of space between plants. If planting more than 1 row, leave 6 ft of space between rows.
Winter Squash	Spaghetti	90	Winter Squash that produces pale to bright yellow, smooth-skinned fruits. When cooked, comb the interior with a fork to make ribbons that look like spaghetti. Excellent with butter and salt, or garlic and olive oil. Plant 1 row in center of raised bed, leaving 1.5 ft of space between plants. If planting more than 1 row, leave 6 ft of space between rows.

Winter Squash	Gold Nugget	85	A bush type winter squash that can be grown in a large container. Each plant can produce up to 6 small fruits that will set in a cluster at the base. Each fruit will resemble a small pumpkin of 1-3 pounds. Each plant can spread up to 3 ft.
Winter Squash	Waltham Butternut	105	Bell-shaped Winter squash with smooth, buff-colored skin with fine-textured, orange flesh that has mild, sweet flavor. Plant 1 row in center of raised bed, leaving 1.5 ft of space between plants. If planting more than 1 row, leave 6 ft of space between rows. Plants grow 2 ft high.
Collard Greens	Southern Georgia	50-80	Large leaves--great as steamed greens, used as wraps or as salad greens when young. Collards can tolerate light frosts, which makes them sweeter. When planting, leave 1 ft of space between plants and 1.5 ft of space between rows.
Mustard Greens	Giant Red	21 baby/ 45 mature	A popular ingredient in salad mixes. Spiciness increases with maturity. Use baby leaves are great for salad or stir fry. Mature leaves are great in stir fry, soups and pickling.

Crop	Variety	Days to Maturity	Additional Plant Info
Kale	Nero Toscano	62	Also known as Lacinato or dinosaur kale. Vigorous dark green leaves traditionally used in soups, stews or sauteed with garlic and olive oil. When planting in raised beds, leave 1 ft of space between plants and 1.5 ft of space between rows.
Kale	Tronchuda	60	A tender, sweet and heat tolerant kale originally from Portugal, where it is enjoyed as a sauteed green and in caldo verde, a kale and potato stew with chorizo. Tasty and nutritious, can be enjoyed throughout the growing season. When planting in raised beds, allow 1 ft of space between plants.
Kale	Red Winter	62	A cold-hardy kale with red-purple frilly leaves. Tolerates temperatures in the teens and will produce until the winter. When planting in raised beds, allow 2 ft of space between plants.
Kale	Red Russain	55	A highly nutritious kale with powerful antioxidant properties that can be eaten as a baby leaf. Also has sweet flavor when allowed to mature to full size leaves. When planting in raised beds, allow 1 ft of space between plants.

Cabbage	Gold Acre	62	Early green heads on compact plants. These cabbages are solid, with a delicate but crunchy texture and sweet, spicy flavor with buttery undertones when cooked. When planting, leave 1 ft of space between plants and 1 ft of space between rows.
Swiss Chard	Five Color Silverbeet	60	A beautiful Australian heirloom leafy green with a mix of red, orange, yellow, pink and white sturdy greens that grow upright. Can be harvested from late spring through Fall. When planting, leave 2 ft of space between plants.
Flowers	Blue Cornflower		Classic flowers with brilliant electric-blue blossoms for a lovely cottage garden display. Flowers are edible--make beautiful salads or use to make an edible blue dye. Bloom from Spring - Summer
Flowers	Calendula		Colorful and diverse mix of varieties with many shapes and colors. European native that has been used for many years in creams to soothe irritated skin. Is also edible and can be used in salads, baked goods or as a substitute for saffron.
Flowers	Sweet Alyssum		Beneficial plant for borders, rock gardens, window boxes and hanging baskets. Flowers Spring-Frost.

Flowers	Cosmos Sensation Blend		Tall with large 3-4" white, pink, rose and crimson flowers. Bloom summer-fall; excellent butterfly lure and cut flowers.
Flowers	Crackerjack Marigold		Hardy annual, 3 ft plant with 4" flowers with bright colors ranging from orange to yellow to tangerine. The flowers are ruffled with traditional marigold fragrance. They also help deter insect pests from your garden!
Flowers	Tangerine Gem Marigold		Small, delicate flowers with a citrusy scent over low mounds of lacy foliage. Great for borders and containers, attracts beneficial insects and the leaves and flowers are edible (do not eat the base of the flower, which is bitter).
Flowers	Irish Eyes Sunflower		Dwarf plants that grow 24-30" and are loaded with multiple blooms that have pointed golden petals and green centers. Great variety for container gardening and cutting.
Flowers	Teddy Bear Sunflower		Dwarf plants grow 18-24". Beautiful double 4-6" golden-yellow blooms make great cut flowers. Great container plant.
Flowers	Red Scarlet Zinnia		Deep scarlet blooms that is cold tolerant and attracts butterflies. Grows up to 3 ft tall.

Flowers	Thumbelina Zinnia		A 1963 All-America Selections winner. Dwarf zinnia that grows 10-16" tall and 8-10" wide. Flowers are 1-1.5" in a wide range of colors--pink, red, yellow, orange.
Herbs	Sweet Basil		Traditional Italian variety with a high yield of large, aromatic leaves.
Herbs	Rosie Basil		Purple-red color with mild basil flavor. Flowers make lovely additions to bouquets.
Herbs	Chives		Perennial. The slender, onion-flavored green foliage can be eaten fresh or cooked; can also be frozen for later use. Produces lavender-pink flowers that are also edible.
Herbs	Forest Green Parsley		Delicately curled and compact variety that has long stems with dark green, double and triple curled leaves. Does well in containers. Leaves are delicious fresh or dried.
Herbs	Mint		Plant in containers, otherwise plant will spread quickly. Aromatic herb for sweet and savory applications--also makes a great tea and herbal garnish for summer cocktails.
